# Dear Friends,

It has been my pleasure to serve as the Interim Moderator in your vacancy, but that is about to come to an end with the induction of the Rev. Philip Wallace. This will be the first induction which you have experienced as a congregation in almost 39 years. It is a time of new beginnings, a time of excitement, but possibly also a time of apprehension.

There will be a new person at the helm, with fresh ideas and different ways of doing things. Inevitably there will be change. This is where the apprehension comes in. You may wonder whether you will like the change and how you will cope with it. We need to remember that we are called to be the pilgrim people of God. The Old Testament character Abraham is a good example of this. He set out from his home in Ur of the Chaldees, leaving behind familiar territory and his kinsfolk, journeying into the unknown with virtually nothing but his faith in God. Most of us like the familiar and we have a tendency to cling to it, whereas we ought to see the Christian life as a journey, placing our trust in God as we travel on.

The one constant on our journey is God Himself, the God whom we worship on a Sunday and whom we seek to serve during the week. He is the same yesterday, today and forever. He has promised to be with us each step of the way.

The Apostle Paul uses a slightly different image for our journey. He likens it to a race. He

describes his own efforts as "forgetting what is behind me, and reaching out for that which lies ahead, I press towards the goal." I guess that he is exaggerating when he says that he forgets the past. Earlier in the same letter he has just boasted of his Jewish ancestry! We cannot forget the past, nor should we attempt to do so. We can allow it to inspire us, but we must not allow it to hinder us. That is the point which I think Paul is really making.

In the meantime enjoy the excitement generated by the induction of your new minister. Enjoy getting to know him and the ways in which he carries out his ministry I wish you God's richest blessing for the years ahead.

# Letter from our Minister-Elect

# Hello!

I am Philip Wallace, the new minister of Renfrew North Parish Church.

I trained for ministry at Mansfield College at the University of Oxford, after working for a number of years as a Trading Standards Officer with Hampshire County Council. My first ministry role was as a probationer minister in Northampton. I then went to the sunshine of Brighton, where I was ordained at Sussex University to be a chaplain to the University of Brighton and a Minister at Lewes Road United Reformed Church.

After a summer spent working with the chaplain at a German village for the elderly, I transferred to the Church of Scotland and was called to Lorne and Lowland Parish Church, Campbeltown, Argyll, in 2004.
