




Now we are busy preparing for the nativity service on Sunday 23 December.

Finance

A BIG Thank You to All! We will reach the end of 2018 financially bruised but still with a positive bank balance - that is with grateful thanks to all of you who supported our Fund Raising, in particular the Voltage Voucher campaign and those who have increased their regular giving.

One year ago, I wrote in Outreach raising the double concerns of Electrical Repairs to the Halls costing some £30,000, while levels of giving had fallen 11% from the previous year.

Barely a month after writing that, including

a throwaway comment that problems never come singly, we suffered a water leak in the Manse which ultimately cost even more than the Hall repairs.

By March I was seriously concerned how we were going to make it through 2018.

A number of matters worked in our favour: a one off opportunity to pull forward our Gift Aid reclaims, a very generous and timely bequest, successful claims to the Cargill Bequest and to Presbytery for a reduction to our Ministry and Mission payments for 2018. Absolutely key however was your energy and generosity!

And on the other subject of giving, I am pleased to report that at the half year we

were 1% UP against 2017.

2018 saw the highest level of expenditure in our history. We have come through without having to commit ourselves to any loans. Our resilience has however taken a dent and another double hit like this would be very, very serious.

Let us take the positives however and congratulate yourselves that we can continue the good work of Renfrew North!

Over the next 3 years the Guild are looking at six projects:

Guild Project -

Malawi Fruits Growing the Future

Malawi Fruits is a Scottish Christian charity committed to working in Malawi to support young farmers-their aim is to lift hundreds of small – scale farmers out of poverty, and see opportunities to bring great help through and crop processing.

Through the guild project they hope to:

- Work with youth groups to train and support the young people to grow cash crops using modern methods
- Provide solar pumps to enable the young people to grow crops using irrigation
- Provide access to a tractor and plough as part of the 'green revolution' for these young farmers

Throughout all of this, they will work with youth groups to help young people recognise this help as a blessing from god and as a connection with the Global Church through the guild and Malawi fruits

This session we have had a varied programme with speakers from **Playlist for Life** – demonstrating the value of personal music for individuals suffering from dementia.

- Rev Yvonne Smith spoke about her first year as a parish minister.
- 'Meet the author Alex Gray' gave us an insight into how she chose the path of a writer:

As you read this we will be approaching our festive programme. One of our own Liz McLay will inspire with Christmas desserts, Jordanhill Parish Church handbell ringers will delight us with their music and we will finish the session with our Carols Coffee and Candles just before Christmas.
